Pastor's Letter

It's not easy for me to sit for any length of time in silence. I usually turn on the radio or the T.V. or some other noise-maker of modern life, reflexively filling the quiet with some sort of chatter. But the other day, I was led into silence by... a bird. A fly-catcher by the name of Phoebe was flitting about the fringes of the porch, obviously incensed that I had rudely placed myself just beneath her nest. She was fed up with her forced eviction and wanted to get back home. She had serious work to do on the nest. There were eggs to warm, feathers to fluff, and life to coax.

Being the obtuse sort, it took me a while to get the message, but eventually I caught on. And I removed myself to the far end of the porch, a safe distance away, but still able to watch Phoebe's activities. As I watched my tail-flicking friend settle into her routine, I found myself settling in, too – slowly, obliviously, sinking into a delicious stillness and calm. That's no small thing for me. Such gifts do not come easily. As the minutes passed, it began to dawn on me that I had been led into an experience of the Presence of God by a fly-catcher. Grasped by the Holy, through the wiles of a little gray bird.

That's just like God. Such a God-ish thing to do. The Eternal One seems to be forever side-stepping all my best efforts to try to track down God, pin down God, locate God in some box or creed or cause...even contain God in the word "God"! Instead, the Holy One cagily lures me into a moment of Encounter when...and where...I don't expect it. In a dirty nest tucked into the joists of an old barn. But then again, I guess God knows about showing up in old barns. Did it once...can do it again!

Over the past few weeks, we've been worshipping in a variety of settings and styles. We've gathered in the valley, by the lake, and on the hill. We've celebrated our Universalist and Methodist roots. We've listened and learned, affirmed and confirmed. And even with all that, we've hardly scratched the surface of holy encounter.

As we move into the sultry days of summer, keep one languid eye on the glass of iced-tea and the other peeled for the flitting grace of God that is ever so nearby.
