## **Pastor's Letter**

I have a tenant living in my house. He's a reputable tenant, by most measures: fully employed, self-sufficient, generally very discreet, and from a large and well-known family. He works the night shift, so our paths rarely cross. My few encounters with him have been amicable enough, although he has, on occasion, kicked up quite a ruckus as he prepares a late night snack. It's a short-coming which I can usually overlook, because I appreciate the nocturnal needs of the American (24/7) labor force. Somebody has to keep the country going through the wee hours of the night.

If you haven't already guessed, my diminutive friend – standing scarcely 3 inches tall and weighing in at about a whisper and a half – is a field mouse. What he lacks in stature, he more than makes up for in pluck and diligence. In fact, there are times when I want to encourage him to lay back, relax, and not labor as though there's no tomorrow. Apparently, he, like me, struggles with embracing a deep sense of Sabbath.

It may come as a surprise to some, but I find comfort in the fact that someone is alive and active even in the dark times of the night. Of course, these days, there's a lot more dark time in which to be active! Sometimes I wonder if the late autumn sun is tapering to such a point that we'll have just enough light to eat lunch, and that's about it. So with such abundance of dark, I find a strange reassurance that my little field marshal...uh, excuse me, field mouse, steps forward to oversee nighttime operations.

This Advent season is about preparing for the coming of the One who oversees all operations, light and dark - the One to whom we turn, in whom we live, throughout every cycle of season, every turn of event. The good news is that as we journey toward winter, the Christmas miracle bursts upon us with the sort of blinding light that is only known when light pierces the deepest darkness - a light that came into the world, which the world could not overcome.

My little friend is a regular presence in the night hours. He scans my home, ever attentive to sources of nutrition and shelter. I welcome him, even if I find him occasionally disturbing or disruptive. But is he so different from the Holy One? Tirelessly, ceaselessly engaged in the world – disruptive at times, discernable only in fits and spurts, and dwelling so very near to each one of us – perhaps nearer than we think?

I wish everyone the grace to hear God's footsteps even in the darkest times, and a feeling of God's steadfast presence as the Christmas hope grows within us. May the gift of Christmas continue to unravel and deepen throughout the year.
